**DRAFT Meeting Minutes**

**BOARD MEMBERS: Present:** Raydene Garrison, President; Beth Field, Vice President; Dixie Alms, Secretary; and Karen Smith, Treasurer.

**President Raydene** called the meeting to order at 10:33 am.

**VISITOR:** Sue Behnert, local quilter, is visiting today.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Karen reported the following:

- Checking Account:** Beginning balance = \$20,772.20; Deposit = \$360.00; Check for new checks = \$26.82; Outstanding checks = \$185.60; Adjusted bank balance = \$20,919.78.
- Education Fund:** Unchanged; balance = \$7906.52.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

**DUES:** If your dues are not paid, you are not receiving the newsletter. Get your \$35 dues to Karen or mail them in.

**COMFORT QUILTS:** Judy Morley is not here to report.

**DAYS FOR GIRLS:** Ann Marie is not here to report.

**UFO CONTRACTS:** Melissa Morgan is running late but has the forms with her. UFO contracts are also online. The UFO contract is your own commitment to pledge any amount you wish to the Guild if you do not complete your unfinished project(s). Since members' contracts with themselves have challenged us to complete our UFOs, these donations to the Guild are down.

**AWARE PILLOWCASES:** Larisa reported that she dropped off pillowcases and receiving blankets last month. She said it was confusing talking to the lady who expressed that they would like personal sized quilts as they have a stash of pillowcases and receiving blankets. It was mentioned last month that OCS needs pillowcases. Larisa will continue to collect pillowcases and will coordinate with AWARE to contact us when they need more. She also has kits ready to be sewn. JoAnn Steineger will contact OCS. The Comfort Quilt committee can address whether our quilts will be given to AWARE.

**EDUCATION COMMITTEE:** Martha Morris reported all who volunteered attended the meeting and were excited. They are in the process of putting together a survey. If you have a favorite teacher, the committee is interested in hearing from us. Bonnie Goodrich and Karen Paulick recently returned from the quilt show in Texas. The committee would like to pick their brains. The committee is still gathering information and has a lot of good ideas to put into the survey. We will be hearing from them in January.

**LAURA HEINE CLASS on FEBRUARY 8-9:** There is one open slot available in the Laura Heine class. Jan Nardone, *Changing Tides*, is talking about bringing up *Maria Schell* next September.

**CITY MUSEUM DISPLAY:** Raydene reported that we hung 16 quilts at the City Museum prior to First Friday this month. Debbie Germain and Dixie Alms volunteered to switch out the display on a monthly basis for First Fridays. Heather Ramseth saw the display and said people loved the information posted by the quilts and added that they wanted information about why the quilt is special. Raydene explained that she provided information to the Museum staff who created what was written up about each quilt. In addition to Raydene; Nancy Woolford, Debbie Germain and Dixie Alms were on hand to hang quilts. Sometime in the new year, it was mentioned that our mug rugs would make a nice display.

Dixie reported in Debbie's absence. We would like Christmas wall hangings to display for Gallery Walk/First Friday. The deadline to get quilts to Dixie or Debbie is Saturday, November 30<sup>th</sup> as Gallery Walk/First Friday is the next week. RainTree Quilting will also collect quilts for us. They must be in a scent free bag!

Wall hangings to be hung need the following:

- Quilt description including who made it and who quilted it.
- Hanging sleeve including dowl rod if you have one. Raydene spent a lot of time attaching sleeves to the quilts that were hung so we didn't have to hang them with thumb tacks, push pins or nails. It's OK if you hang your quilts with those items at home, but we don't want to put those kinds of holes in your beautiful work!

**CHRISTMAS PARTY:** Terri Bonnell reported that our party will be December 7<sup>th</sup> from 2-5 pm at the Valley Church on the Back Loop Road. Please bring food items for their food bank as part of our rental payment for their facility; Karen Paulick challenged us to bring a case of food rather than just a can or two. Our menu is appetizers and light desserts. Silent auction items need to go to Terri or to Beth Field. Bring in a Frost or Flannel fat quarter for the basket in memory of Susanne Forsling; someone will win the basket at the party. Cookie exchange for those interested. The beautiful, large raffle

quilt has been donated by Bonnie! The seven participants in the Christmas in July quilts will be exchanged. Bring cash for the raffle games. Bring a friend and have fun!

**WEBSITE:** Karen Paulick reported that the new website has been up for a while. Almost everything is click-able. More information will be added, but we have Quilt Show pictures and a newsletter posted as well as forms, including the UFO form. The password for the member section is Sew4Me. If you have questions or problems navigating the site, contact Karen. Due to privacy, the Directory is not on the website.

**DIRECTORY:** Bonnie said she is unable to open the directory. She asked if it could be published in PDF format. Christine will try. Christine needs to have the most current updated directory for newsletter purposes. She would like us to print out a copy of the directory for our reference. She asked if it could be airdropped to everyone. Nancy Woolford said there is a system on Yahoo, but it is difficult to navigate. Again, the directory was not posted on the website due to potential privacy issues.

**FINANCIAL AUDIT:** Karen and Beth expressed frustration as they have not been able to access our accounts via online access. They have spent many hours attempting to reset the password without success and have gone round and round with bank personnel. Christine Moleski is on the board at True North and will check into the problems. Becky Frederick will assist Karen and Beth with the audit after they can get into our accounts online.

**BUDGET:** Raydene sent out a copy of the proposed budget that needs to be voted on today. She put in \$650 for a computer and \$350 for software that we may need. Martha Morris moved we accept the budget as presented; Judy Macnak seconded; motion passed unanimously.

**CHURCH RENTAL:** After meeting with Pastor Tari last month, Raydene put notes into the newsletter regarding how we need to improve our cleanup when leaving the church on meeting/UFO days. Our rent is \$75/month which includes our use of this room, the kitchen and our storage upstairs. We are also expected to bring in \$75 donation in food for the foodbank. Raydene said she was the first to arrive this morning followed by Larisa who took pictures of the room. Each member is asked to be a good neighbor when leaving and ask if there is anything that can be done to help. Raydene would like to laminate a "clean up" sign to hang on the door; it also needs to be published in the newsletter and could be put in the Member Only section of the website.

**MEMBER INTERVIEW:** Heather Ramseth will interview the next person.

**DISCUSSION/CONCERNS:** Christine will do a survey to address the following:

1-Rumor says some people are not coming, because open sew doesn't start until the middle of the day.

2-Some people expressed interest in having the meeting earlier on the same day.

Another suggested the meeting would never end if it started earlier as it is easier to keep extending it.

3-Others expressed they will not come at night.

4-It was suggested we have our meeting on another day.

5-Rental space in a school is more expensive and requires a bond.

**CHALLENGE:** After Dixie shared the nametag Debbie Germain made for her in embroidery class this month, Raydene challenged everyone to make a nametag for themselves or for someone else by our February 15<sup>th</sup> meeting. She will have a prize for someone.
